The Career Bootcamp will be a half-day session during the 2012 ASCPT Annual Meeting on Saturday, 17 March. The program will provide valuable information on negotiating a starting package, a five-year plan to jump-start your career, how to find a mentor, grants and non-NIH funding, and the NIH. A separate registration fee of \$50 for ASCPT member trainees and junior faculty and \$75 for nonmember trainees and junior faculty will be required for this program.

Call for latebreaking abstract submissions

ASCPT is now accepting late-breaking abstract submissions for consideration for the 2012 Annual Meeting. Late-breaking abstracts represent studies that were ongoing at the time of the regular submission deadline and that reached an interim analysis, final data collection, or other *a priori* study design after the regular submission deadline. Late-breaking abstracts will not be printed in the Annual Meeting program or be published in the March supplement of *Clinical Pharmacology & Therapeutics*. The deadline to submit your late-breaking abstract is Friday, 16 December 2011.

Satsuki Yamada, MD, PhD, Assistant Professor of Medicine, Division of Cardiovascular Diseases, Department of



Medicine, Mayo Clinic, Rochester, MN Dr. Yamada is a physician–scientist specializing in clinical pharmacology applied to cardiovascular medicine. She completed medical and graduate training in Japan, earning both her MD and PhD from the University of Tsukuba. Her thesis consisted of defining cardiac

wavelet patterns in health and disease using magnetocardiography and pharmacological intervention. Dr. Yamada joined ASCPT after joining the Mayo Clinic to work with Andre Terzic, MD, PhD, a longtime member of the Society. She appreciates many of the benefits of being a member of the Society, especially those that provide the opportunity to network and develop her career. Dr. Yamada was the recipient of the ASCPT Young Investigator Award in 2008 and the Presidential Trainee Award in 2011. Her current research interests include clinical pharmacology in the emerging area of stem cell-based biologics and high-resolution cardiac imaging focused on proof-of-concept science for risk stratification and prediction/ monitoring of therapeutic outcome in regenerative cardiac repair.
